MID DEVON'S FARM SHOPS & FA

Many of our farms provide farm shops that you can visit at your pleasure.

1. West Middlewick Farm (Nomansland, Tiverton): Choice selections of high quality beef, pork and lamb, dairy products and fresh fruit and vegetables. They also sell their own homemade soap, sheepskins and souvenirs. **Open 7 days a week.**

2. Blackberry Lane (Lapford): Healthy and flavoursome fruit and veg, grown authentically without fertilisers, pesticides or herbicides. **Open Tuesday - Saturday.**

3. Nomansland Farm Shop (Shobrooke): A working farm with caravan and camping pitches and onsite farm shop selling a range of local produce.

4. Exe Valley Farm Shop (Thorverton): Onsite café and butchery with milk vending machine, **open 7 days a week.**

5. Fordmore Farm Shop (Cullompton): Shop and café with butchery and other locally sourced organic produce. **Open 7 days a week.**

6. Halberton Court (Halberton): A fine selection of local produce including vegetables, fruit, meat, dairy, beer, cider and much more. Pick your own seasonal fruit (including strawberries, raspberries, currants and pumpkins). Onsite café with footpath access to the Swan's Neck Grand Western Canal walk. **Open Monday - Saturday.**

7. Little Tuberfield (Sampford Peverell): selling locally produced meat, poultry and vegetables, homemade sausages and burgers, freshly baked pies and pasties and soft drinks. **Open Tuesday - Saturday.**

8. Quicke's Cheese Box (Newton St Cyres): Award-winning cheesemakers from Devon. **Open Monday - Friday.**

9. The Plant Shed (Eggesford): Supplying an array of local produce and plants. **Open Tuesdays to Saturdays**

10. Thorne's Farm Shop (Stockleigh Pomeroy): A wide variety of fresh fruit and vegetables and other local produce including fresh bread, meat pies and pasties. Pick your own seasonal produce (including strawberries and runner beans) with onsite café. **Open Monday to Saturday.**

11. Coplestone Farm Shop (Coplestone): Offering an array of local produce and plants. Visit them on a Saturday for special "meet the maker" showcases. **Open 7 days a week.**

12. The Milk Stand at Palmers Farm (Clayhidon): Enjoy fresh gently pasteurised whole milk in 1 litre reusable glass bottles or 500ml compostable paper cups. You can also create your own delicious milkshakes at the mooshake bar.



FARMERS' MARKETS



We recommend you double check opening times with the operators before visiting.

Mid Devon has several regular farmers' markets offering farm-to-fork produce, all grown or reared within a 30 mile radius.

A. Cullompton Farmers' Market: Held on the second Saturday each month (usually from 9.30am to 12.30pm) at the Higher Bullring. Refreshments and hot food are also available.

B. Bridwell Park Pop-Up Market: The 'Artisans & Makers Market' is an outdoor Pop-Up Sunday market adjoining The Orangery Pop-Up Café at Bridwell Park Estate in Uffculme. The Market takes place on selected Sundays only between April & October, 10am til 4pm.

C. Crediton Farmers' Market: Award-winning farmers' market that takes place on the first and

third Saturdays of every month in Crediton Town Square, 10am - 1pm. Seating area with hot food and refreshments available.

D. Tiverton Farmers' Market: Takes place on the first Saturday of every month, 9am - 2pm, alongside the regular General Market. Onsite café and parking in the Market Car Park.

E. Uffculme Farmers' Market: Takes place once a month, offering a selection of local produce (normally the fourth Saturday of every month) at Uffculme Village Hall, 10am - 12noon.

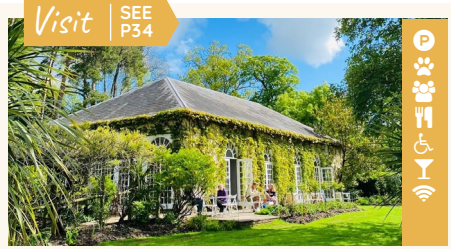

The town is known for its beautiful architecture. Highlights include **Tiverton Castle** and the

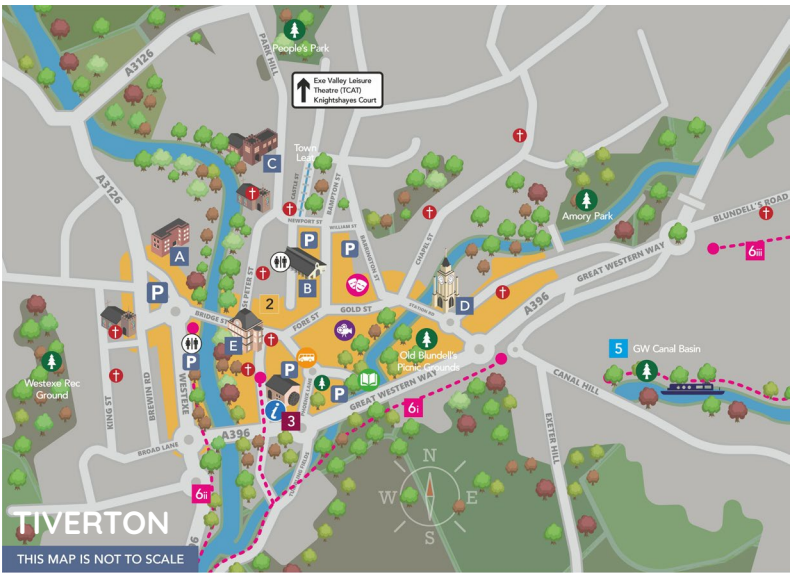
National Trust's **Knights Hayes Court**. The award-winning **Tiverton Museum of Mid Devon Life** showcases the region's rich history and heritage.

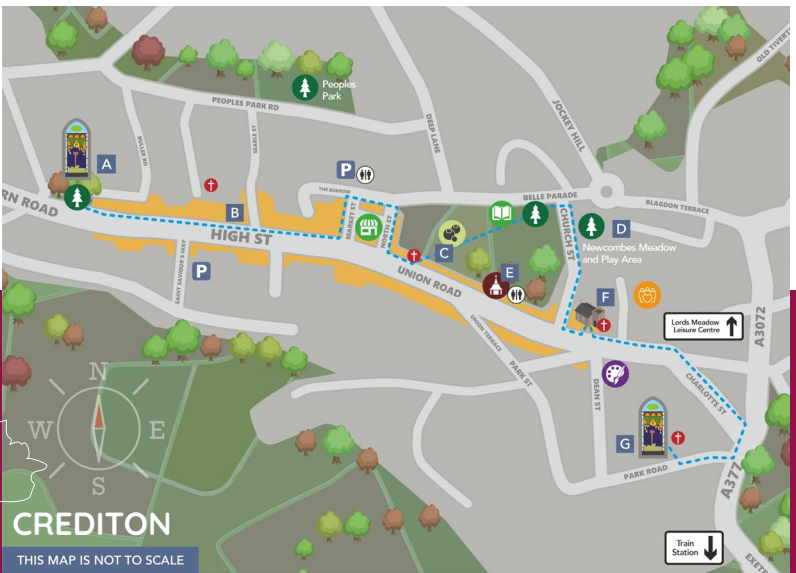

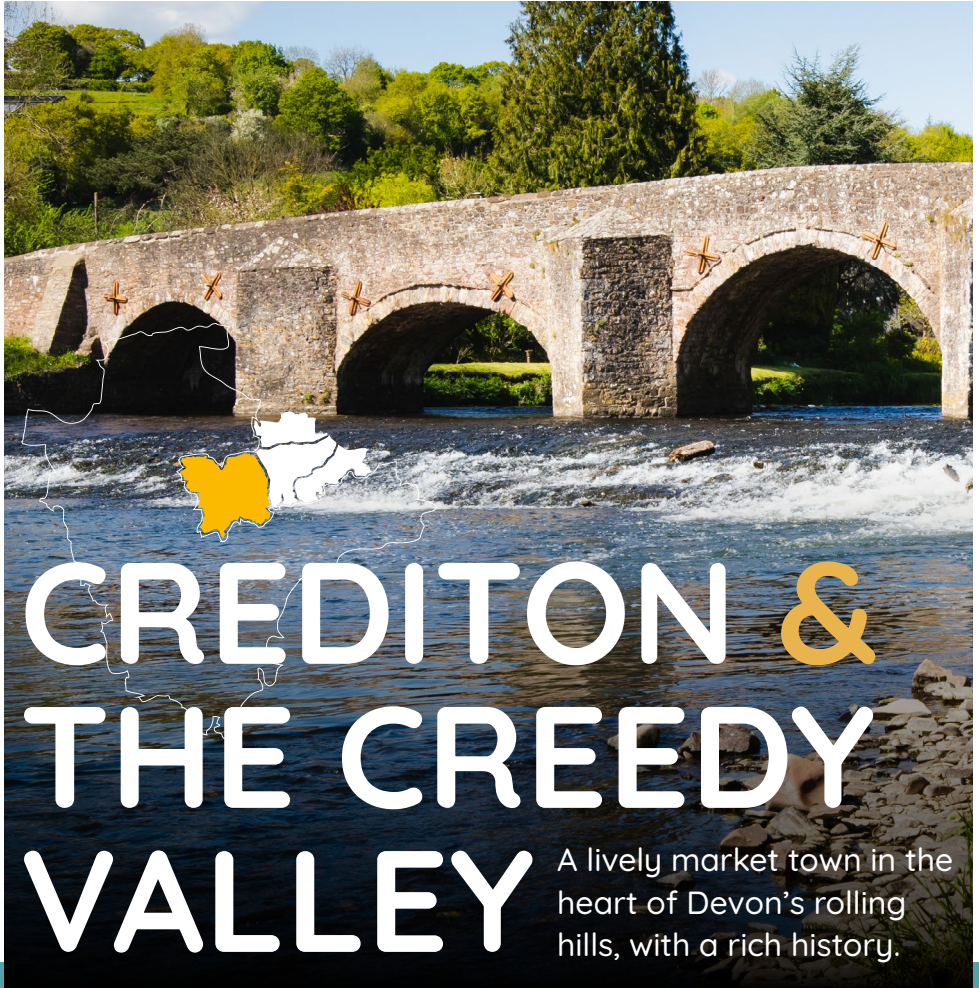

Visitors to CREDITON can explore the town's rich history. The town is home to several historic buildings, including the beautiful 14th-century **Church of the Holy Cross**, and nearby **Fursdon House**.

CREDITON has several cafés, restaurants, and pubs offering delicious local produce and craft beers. Many independent retailers and a thriving farmers' market, make CREDITON an ideal place to escape the monotony of the high street, buy unique gifts and sample locally sourced food and drink.

Check out the programme at **CREDITON Arts Centre** for a spot of culture or head into

CREDITON Museum to discover the town's fascinating heritage.

For those who love the great outdoors, the town is surrounded by stunning countryside, with plenty of opportunities for walking, cycling, including nearby **Shobrooke Park** and **Eggesford Forest**.

This historic market town is a convenient place to stay if you're planning a trip to Dartmoor, with regular trains running along the **Dartmoor Line** from CREDITON to Okehampton. The scenic **Tarka Line** also stops in CREDITON on its journey between Exeter and Barnstaple.

A beautiful countryside town packed with heritage.

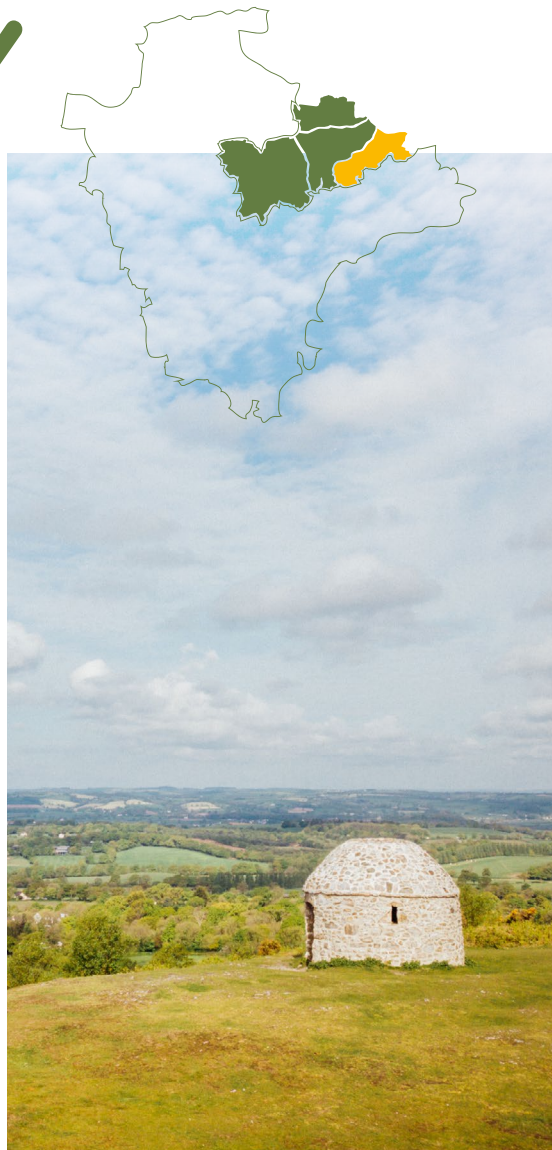
Set within the tranquil Culm Valley, close to Exeter and surrounded by countryside, Cullompton is the ideal holiday location to escape into peaceful surroundings, get back to nature and explore the wonderful rural setting of Mid Devon.

Cullompton's vibrant **Farmers' Markets** offer a range of local produce, crafts, and gifts and you'll find welcoming cafés and restaurants.

Cullompton is also the gateway to the Culm Valley and **Blackdown Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty**, including stunning views from the Elizabethan **Culmstock Beacon** (pictured). Honeycombed with footpaths, bridleways, and cycle trails, this is wonderful countryside to explore.

The town is home to several historic buildings revealing its rich heritage, including the impressive 15th-century **St. Andrew's Church**, tudor town house the **Walronds** and the nearby National Trust property **Killerton**. In nearby Uffculme you'll find more evidence of the area's fascinating heritage at **Coldharbour Mill**.

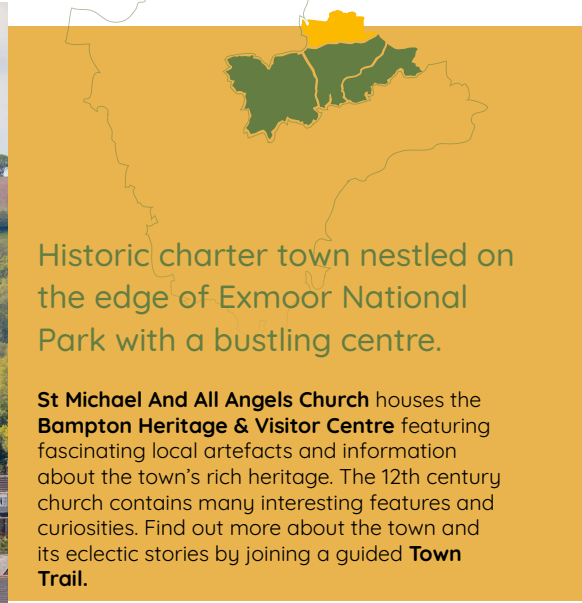

Historic charter town nestled on the edge of Exmoor National Park with a bustling centre.

St Michael And All Angels Church houses the **Bampton Heritage & Visitor Centre** featuring fascinating local artefacts and information about the town's rich heritage. The 12th century church contains many interesting features and curiosities. Find out more about the town and its eclectic stories by joining a guided **Town Trail**.

There are an abundance of quirky independent retailers, as well as a traditional pharmacy, greengrocers and butchers. Foodies will be well satisfied with more than one award-winning eatery to choose from.

Bampton's **Norman motte** is one of the best preserved in Devon and offers wonderful views. The Exe Valley Way runs through the town and lots of footpaths meander through the surrounding woodland. The wilderness of **Exmoor**, its famous ponies, and the real-life locations of Lorna Doone, is just a stone's throw away. Cyclists can challenge themselves on routes around the winding country roads and steep climbs of Devon's typical rolling hills.

Every October the town holds the ancient **Bampton Charter Fair** which is over 750 years old - lively fun and entertainment for all ages.

SHOPPING

Shopping in Mid Devon is a breath of fresh air offering a break from the high street experience.

You'll find a range of independent stores, local markets, and boutiques that offer a variety of handmade and artisanal products. The region is known for its traditional crafts, which can be found in many of the local shops, galleries and markets. UNCOVER MID DEVON'S HERITAGE

Mid Devon has a rich and varied history. Human settlement dates back to the Neolithic period, and there's still some evidence of Iron Age hill forts.

Mid Devon prospered in the post medieval Wool Trade, and lots of our historic towns and villages grew up around the industry. The region, and its castles, also had a part to play in the English Civil War, with several battles taking place here. Today, Mid Devon is a popular destination for history enthusiasts, with many attractions and landmarks showcasing our fascinating past.

Have a wander around Mid Devon with your gaze pointed upward (while avoiding walking into the path of other people and traffic of course!) at our towers, turrets, chimneys and hillsides to see what you can discover...



CASTLES

Tiverton Castle was once home to medieval Earls and a Plantagenet Princess. Today it houses an impressive collection of Civil War weaponry and real suits of armour to try on.

Nestled in the Exe Valley, **Bickleigh Castle** dates back to 600AD and a guided tour with a resident expert will unlock its intriguing stories.

There is evidence of more castles in Mid Devon to explore. The Iron Age hillfort of **Cadbury Castle** is part of the Fursdon Estate and has breathtaking views across the Exe Valley, while the Norman **Bampton Castle Motte** gives picturesque views over the village. At both sites you'll find information boards telling you more about their history. You can also visit the remains of the ruined 14th century **Hemyock Castle**, a rare medieval moated castle besieged in the Civil War, on special open days.

Not a castle, but it's worth taking a walk up to the Elizabethan **Culmstock Beacon** for fabulous scenic views across the Culm Valley and Blackdown Hills.

COUNTRY ESTATES & TOWN HOUSES

Fursdon House is one of the oldest family homes in Devon with the family's roots there going back over 700 years. During summer months you can explore the restored garden, manor house and family museum.

18th century **Killerton**, near Broadclyst, has a fabulous landscape garden with quirky details and a wonderful costume collection. **Knightshayes**, on the edge of Tiverton, is an imposing Gothic Revival mansion designed by William Burges, with a lovely walled kitchen garden and excellent views across Tiverton. Both properties are owned by the National Trust.

The Walronds in Cullompton is a late Tudor manor house tucked right in off the main street. The walled garden is open daily and beautifully restored ground floor rooms are open for special event days and craft markets.

RELIGIOUS BUILDINGS

Mid Devon is home to a number of interesting (and photogenic!) churches. Together, these churches provide a fascinating insight into the religious and cultural heritage of Mid Devon.

St Andrew's Church in Cullompton features an impressive stone tower and, like others featured here, appears in Simon Jenkins' 'England's Thousand Best Churches' book. **Crediton Parish Church of The Holy Cross** (pictured) is a grand building with a fascinating history and the town itself has links to St Boniface. Don't miss the 15th century Greenway Chapel of **St. Peter's Church** in Tiverton. Built by a wealthy wool merchant, its detailed carvings and vaulted ceiling are well worth a visit. **St Michael and All Angels Church** in Bampton has the oldest sundial in Devon, a great example of a Devon wagon roof dating from 1450 and traces of original medieval painting. It also houses **Bampton Heritage and Visitor Centre**.

There are many other religious buildings to be found in Mid Devon. Some highlights to look out for on your travels include:

- The 200 year-old yew tree growing from the top of the tower at **All Saints Church**, Culmstock.
- **Ayshford Chapel** which can be seen from the Grand Western Canal near Sampford Peverell, with its salmon pink limewashed walls.
- The little church at **Loxbeare**, with its Norman tower.
- The chequerboard stonework on the tower of the **Church of St Mary** in Kentisbeare.
- The named pews in Cruwys Morchard's **Church of the Holy Cross**.
- Medieval Plymtree's **St John the Baptist Church** with its gilded screen.
- The painted rood screen of Uffculme's **Church of St Mary**.

DISCOVER MORE

If you'd like to learn more about Mid Devon's history there's no better place to start than in one of our museums. Visit **Tiverton Museum**, **Crediton Museum** and **Bampton Heritage and Visitor Centre** to get an insight into the region's history. You can also take a self-guided walk around most of our towns with a heritage trail picked up from an information centre or museum. Tiverton Museum and Bampton Heritage and Visitor Centre both offer guided tours on the histories of their towns.

REST & RELAXATION

Mid Devon offers a range of accommodations to suit all tastes and budgets.

For those seeking a countryside retreat, there are plenty of charming bed and breakfasts, guesthouses, and self-catering cottages dotted throughout the region. Many of these are located in picturesque villages that offer a warm and friendly welcome to visitors.

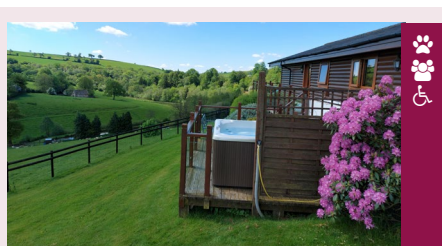

IN THE PINK

The elephant hawkmoth puts paid to any lingering thoughts that moths are just the drab cousins to beautiful butterflies. **Devon Wildlife Trust's Steve Hussey** takes a look at this spectacular Mid Devon moth and its relatives...



See an elephant hawkmoth and you won't forget it. Its angle-sharp wings suggest a jet aircraft, but this outline is softened by lipstick-pink lines against a soft green-gold body. It's a beauty!

These big moths, which can reach wingspans of up to 6cm, can sometimes be seen at night, feeding on the nectar of plants which include honeysuckle. But you're more likely to spot an elephant hawkmoth resting during the day, tucked in amongst foliage.

Adults fly from May to August each summer. The good news is that you can begin your search for an elephant hawkmoth close to home or wherever you're staying in Mid Devon. They are often spotted in gardens,

allotments or parks - in the countryside and in towns. Other common locations include patches of waste ground, hedgerows and many of Devon Wildlife Trust's 60 nature reserves.

Elephant hawkmoths get their name from their distinctive caterpillars. These can be spotted in late summer inching their way over the ground. They possess distinctive eyespots and thick grey-green coloured bodies which give them a passing resemblance to an elephant's trunk.

These remarkable looking insects are among a family of large and colourful moths. Here are three others to look out for this summer:

LIME HAWKMOTH

The lime hawkmoth is a large hawkmoth, on the wing from May to July. It is commonly found in parks and gardens, as well as woodland, but flies only on warm nights. The caterpillars are quite distinctive: large and green, with pale streaks on each segment and a bluish 'horn' at the tail end. They feed at night on the leaves of lime, silver birch and elm, but the adults don't feed at all. During the day, the adults rest to avoid catching the attention of predators.



PRIVET HAWKMOTH

The privet hawkmoth is a very large hawkmoth that is on the wing for a short period in June and July. It is commonly found in parks and gardens, as well as woodland. The adults are attractive, but it is the large caterpillars that really catch the eye: lime-green with a purple bluish, purple-and-white streaks on the side, a pale-yellow spot on each segment, and a big, blackish hook at the tail end. The caterpillars feed mainly on privet, but also on ash and lilac leaves.



HUMMINGBIRD HAWKMOTH

The hummingbird hawkmoth is a small, day-flying moth. It is a summer visitor to the UK, migrating from Southern Europe in variable numbers each year. In some years, it can be common and may be seen in gardens, hovering like a hummingbird as it feeds on the nectar of honeysuckle, red valerian and other flowers. It can also be found along woodland edges, and on heathland and scrub. The caterpillars feed on various species of bedstraw, so the female adult moths lay their eggs on the buds or flowers of these plants.

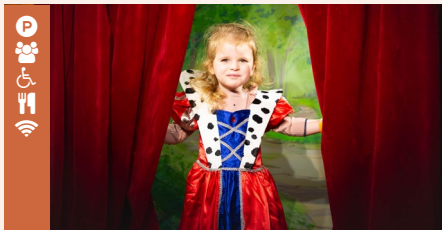

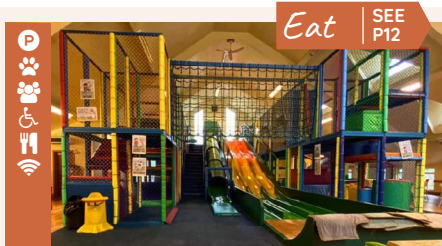

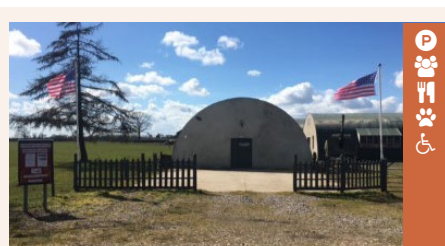
